Prior to the establishment of Koorimunication, she enjoyed a Public Service career spanning more than 35 years across NSW State and Federal Governments.

As a Senior Indigenous Advisor in the NSW Department of Premier & Cabinet for almost ten years Julie was instrumental in the introduction of the successful Indigenous Cadetship Program for the NSW Public Sector – where none previously existed. Julie also assisted in the development of the NSW State Government E-Learning Aboriginal Mentoring program. She has extensive experience in Aboriginal mentoring, cross cultural communications, developing and evaluating Aboriginal employment strategies, community consultations, human services policy and program development and evaluation, training, strategic planning, and public relations.

Her tertiary qualifications include a Bachelor of Laws and a Bachelor of Arts (major in Australian History), through the University of Wollongong. Maintaining connection with family and community are highly valued by Julie.
